YARD CARE: The following was received from Metco Landscape.

Water trees, shrubs, lawns, and perennials during prolonged dry fall and winter periods to prevent root damage that affects the health of the entire tree.

Water only when air and soil temperatures are above 40 degrees F with no snow cover.

Established large trees have a root spread equal to or greater than the height of the tree. Apply water to the most critical part of the root zone within the dripline.

The "innards" and "outers of a Turkey Dinner

Last year I ate my 1st Thanksgiving dinner put on by the Women's Club. I was oblivious to all the work and expenses involved. The ladies have many fund raisers to help pay for 15 - 20 turkeys, 50#s of potatoes, 300 rolls, cans of yams, cranberries, pumpkin pies, stuffing, etc. for approximately 164 residents. Chinette plates, tablecloths, napkins, and cups are not cheap.

Grocery stores don't deliver! The week before we bargain shop for all the above items, plus, later in the week, we deliver to WC club members who willingly bake and cook in their own homes.

Friday afternoon...volunteers meet to set tables and chairs, spiff up the hall, get out sugar and creamers, wash and fill salt and pepper shakers, wrap real silverware, the to-do list continues.

On Turkey-day, the kitchen crew chops veggies for stuffing, makes the gravy and beans. Coffee urns are filled to plug in later, juice is mixed and 20 pies sliced. The afternoon gets hectic. The sound system is set up, turkeys and potatoes arrive or are picked up, long lists are checked and double checked so nothing is forgotten.
