A GLIMPSE IN THE REARVIEW MIRROR...



They were simply called "Buffalo Guns" by those in the West who knew these rifles. They were the rifles that the thousands of buffalo hunters took to the buffalo fields and prairies from the mid-1860s to the late 1880s. To the buffalo hunter, the rifle was the number one tool of his trade and represented his dearest possession on earth. In most cases, the buffalo hunter had an almost spiritual relationship with his rifle, and he recognized that relationship with a special name or term of endearment. "I can replace my horse and mules, but 'Martha' cannot be replaced. I'll shoot any man who tries to take her."

The buffalo rifles were big caliber guns that were black-powder powered in the 1860s. By the 1880s, most rifles were firing fast-burning smokeless powder, increasing both their already

FREE PROGRAMS

There are two separate programs that exist only for Wolhurst residents living on the Arapahoe side of the park. his breech-loading Sharps rifle in 1848, receiving a patent for the design in September of the same year. The Sharps *Big Fifty* continued to be manufactured in various calibers for thirty-three years after its introduction. The most popular caliber in the buffalo fields was the .50 caliber firing a three and a quarter inch, straight taper cartridge that incorporated a 550 grain bullet. Buffalo hunters likened the Sharps' three and a quarter inch round to a stick of dynamite, "...iAA't'll knock down the animal in front of the rifle and the hunter behind the rifle ...darn near the same time!"

The Remington No. 1 was designed in the mid-1860s for use with smokeless powder. Its unique *Rolling Block* action became an overnight sensation because of its ability to handle heavy powder loads with ease. It was less prevalent in the buffalo field than either the Springfield or the Sharps, but, buffalo hunters found both its .45-70 and .50-70 cartridges very effective in the buffalo fields at 150 yard distances.
