**BLOCK CAPTAINS:** Block captains have three primary responsibilities:

1. Notify their area of any emergency information as given out by park management. This is done either by calling the resident or, going door to door.
2. Delivery the monthly Gazebo to each resident in their area.
3. Notify park management of any problems in their area.
4. Attend Block Captain meetings on the last Monday of each month. The meetings are at 9:30 a.m.

**LAWN CARE:** Terracare Associates has been selected to mow and trim our grass this year. If you do not want your mowed or trimmed, put a sign to this effect in your yard. However, once you decide not to receive this service, you cannot start at a later date. It's all or none. No fenced areas will be cut.



**GAZEBO DELIVERY:** Tell your block captain if there is a specific place you want the Gazebo put. Try a large binder clip attached to your deck.

**SWIMMING POOL:** The swimming pool will open on Memorial Day weekend. Remember the following basic rules:



1. All guests must have a resident present in the pool area.
2. Only appropriate swimming attire is permitted. No cutoffs, shirts, etc.
3. No food or drink is allowed beyond the yellow line.

4. Smoking is allowed only on the east side marked by a yellow line.

5. Pool hours are 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. every day.

6. No running or diving.

**WATERING RESTRICTIONS:** The 2015 watering restrictions have not been received, so Wolhurst will use those from 2014 until further notice:



1. Watering is not allowed between 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

2. Water no more than 3 days per week.

3. Do not allow water to pool in gutters, streets, and alleys.

4. Do not waster water by letting it spray on concrete or asphalt.

5. Repair sprinkler system leaks immediately.

6. Do not water when it is raining or during high winds.

7. Use a hose nozzle with a shut off valve when washing your car.

**LAKE WATER:** The lake water has been turned on.

**NSF:** Returned checks will now incur a \$40.00 service charge.

## BEAR WISE

### Hello neighbors, Beary Bear here.

After my long winter nap, the warmer weather and melting snow are telling me it's time to wake up for the season.

#### Surprise Awakening

Some female bears are waking up to find a young cub or two sharing their den beds. These youngsters are born while mom is hibernating and will be with her for a couple of years. New moms are very protective of their young so use extra caution if you spot a young one in your area – mom's usually not far away.

#### Now Appearing.....

Once we are up and out, our number one priority is replacing the pounds we lost over the winter months and shedding our thick winter coats. There's only one thing worse than a bad case of "bed head" and that's bed head and hungry! Spring fixings are a bit limited until summer is in full bloom so we are especially eager to discover supplements like the contents in your BBQ, bird feeders and garbage cans.

So now is prime time to begin your 2015 bear proofing routines:

- Make sure trash is stored in a bear proof container (lockable lid) in a secured shed or garage. Set trash cans out on the morning of pickup not the night before.
- Hang bird feeders 10 feet up and 10 feet out from any climbable structure during the day. Bring them in at dusk for the night.
- Secure windows and doors.
- Supervise children and pets when they are outside.

Bears are nocturnal and we do our best snooping for new and easy food sources after dark. But as the days get longer it's not uncommon to see us "day lighting" most any time.

#### Bearified

We have amazing "rememberers" so if we "tag" your residence as a great place to eat we will return later to see if you are offering second helpings. I especially like the late night "prowl thru". I'm always hoping to encounter the resident dog that says: "I didn't see nuttin" rather than one who barks me away. Once your garbage containers get rolled, consider your place "bearified" as a great place to dine. Easy dinner spots don't stay secret for long among our nose worthy group. However, once you bear proof your surroundings we will move on to easier picnic grounds down the street.

Remember that our natural state is shy and illusive. If you observe rare aggressive bear behavior – like not leaving the area in your presence when a clear path to retreat is available - report the incident to the Colorado Parks & Wildlife or visit the website at [www.wildlife.state.co.us/bears](http://www.wildlife.state.co.us/bears) for more information.
