**Carrot Souffle**

- 1 3/4 lbs peeled & chopped carrots
- 1 C white sugar
- 1 1/2 t vanilla extract
- 3 eggs beaten with a mixer
- 2 T powered sugar
- 1 1/2 T baking powder
- 2 T all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup softened butter or margarine

Preheat oven to 350 degrees

In a large pot, cook carrots until tender., drain and transfer to a large mixing bowl. While carrots are warm, add sugar, baking powder and vanilla. Beat un-

til smooth, then mix in flour, eggs and butter. Transfer to a 2 qt. baking dish. Bake 1 hour. Cool. Sprinkle with powdered sugar.


