## UNDERSTANDING COLORADO'S NEW END-OF-LIFE OPTIONS ACT

Last summer, I helped gather signatures to place Proposition 106, The End-of-Life Options Act that authorized terminally ill adults to have the option of medical aid in dying, on the ballot. Many of the people I spoke to had a story about loved ones who could have benefited from medical aid in dying or shared how they wanted this option on the table for themselves. The End-of-Life Options Act passed with overwhelming support in November 2016, and the law went into effect in December. Now that Coloradans have this option, it's important to know how the law works.

To be eligible under the law, a person must be an adult who is terminally ill with a prognosis of six months or fewer to live and mentally capable of making personal medical decisions. In addition to these requirements, the person must also be a resident of Colorado, acting voluntarily and making an informed decision that includes being given information on all end-of-life options. A person accessing the law is required to have the ability to self-administer the medication by ingesting it. The terminally ill adults must also be informed that they may decide not to take the prescribed aid-in-dying medication, even after they have obtained it.

Medical aid in dying is the option of last resort for terminally ill adults when no other palliative treatment will provide relief from intolerable suffering. It is a safe and trusted medical practice to bring about a peaceful death.

Compassion and Choices, the nation's oldest, largest and most active nonprofit organization committed to improving care and expanding options for the end of life, also provides a Find Care Tool on the organization's website, helping people find facilities that are supportive of their end-of-life decisions. Terminally ill adults should be empowered to make their own decisions about their treatment options, including the full range of end-of-life care options, based on their values, in consultation with their doctor and loved ones. It is important for terminally ill adults to start these conversations with their doctors and loved ones as early as possible because it can take a minimum of 15 days and usually takes much longer to get a prescription for medical aid in dying even if your healthcare system has policies in place to support patient end-of-life decisions.

Accessing medical aid in dying does not affect a person's will or insurance. The underlying illness must be listed as the cause of death on a person's death certificate. The law specifies that a death resulting from self-administering aid-in-dying medication is not suicide.

Studies show terminally ill adults get a huge sense of relief knowing medical aid in dying is available -- whether they get a prescription or not -- because having this option means they

won't have to suffer needlessly, enabling them to enjoy their remaining days as fully as possible.

I witnessed the painful natural death of my mother-in-law. I also heard from many of you in our area who had similar touching stories of loved ones who endured difficult and painful ending days of their lives. I know from others, that having your end of life preparations complete makes a difficult and sometimes tragic time at least bearable for loved ones who must deal with all the arrangements after each of us dies. I would therefore encourage everyone to think carefully about what you want when your death nears. None of us knows when that moment will happen. Prepare now the written legal documents (will, living will, Colorado MOST form, durable powers of attorney, etc.) that identify your end-of-life wishes.

Most importantly - have the conversations with your loved ones and doctors so they know your end of life wishes. Do it now.
